We sinners are always prone to raise ourselves up
by stepping on others, even in small, subtle ways.

We need to confess. We need God's forgiveness.

See? WOW! He does forgive. No one can talk about the sweetness in the Good News of Jesus the way we can when we've confessed and received absolution. We have tasted and seen that the Lord is good. So good that He died for us is He, and so good that He rose and rules. Your sin stands removed far as the east is from the west. Yours!
