The Law leaves us naked, but God clothes us with the garment of Christ's righteousness. He calls us His children, heirs, saints, household, temple. Our disgrace was laid on Christ, so that everything Christ has could become ours.

This is the only dignity that matters. It is an eternal dignity. The prestige, superiority, and applause people that crave and strive for – these all] stand under the judgment of God.

Christians have a divine dignity that cannot be taken away from them. It will not make them tense and anxious.

See? **WOW!** When we bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to people, it does things. It confers a divine dignity.

Worth considering:

Going on the Offensive with the Gospel

Our status as priests comes as a gift from God, a privilege He gives us. He has not whisked us out of the world.

At times, you might find in this fact some reason for regret. If God had simply taken you to heaven as soon as you were converted, you would be spared the temptations and trouble of this world.

Yet the Lord didn't want to do things that way because He wasn't finished giving. He wanted to give to you yet again. This time, He gives you and me the privilege of representing Him, of being His priests, who can both call on His name and speak His Word.

In many ways, the world can be frustrating and offensive to us Christians. For instance, we see that the world around us is, well, worldly. It gets caught up in itself or in the things money can buy or in the pleasures of the moment. We can think long and hard about how terrible all this is, but the Lord has given us the gift of being able to go on the offensive against that kind of thing by taking His Word to people. "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news" [Isaiah 52:7a].

Other things in the sinful world offend and disgust us too, such as a lack of regard for God's Word. So often, people don't think about the Scriptures at all. If they do, it seems to be to hold the Bible up to ridicule, to create doubts concerning it, or to announce their own pet theory, which they deem as good as anything in Scripture. Ultimately, the best defense for God's Word *is* God's Word. He gives us the great privilege that we can unleash this

powerful Word upon people. In the midst of their doubts, questions, and unbelief, He gives us a Word that is "sharper than any two-edged sword" (Hebrews 4:12).

We can get frustrated by people who just sit there waiting for God to "zap" them out of the blue, especially because we know God works through His Word and through people who spread His Word. He gives us the gift of being people who can spread His Word! Instead of wallowing in our frustration that others are simply sitting there waiting for God to zap them, we can bring them the Christ-centered Word, which is His own power to save.

In any case, however, we are motivated for the mission God has given us as His priests not simply because we are against all the things in the world that offend or frustrate us. At bottom, mission is not about our feelings.

Nor, at bottom, is it being *against* things. We are *for* mission because God in Christ is *for* us. He has called us out of darkness into His marvelous light. However exciting it may be that the Gospel is for everyone else, can the Christian ever do other than rejoice that it is for me? With this pointed and powerful Good News, the Lord catches us up into His mission.
