### “Remember That You Are Dust”

Lent begins with a simple and sobering confession: “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return” (Genesis 3:19). These words do not crush us, but place us rightly before God. They remind us that life is not ours by right, that strength and security are fragile gifts, and that sin has touched every part of our being. “All flesh is grass,” the prophet declares, “and all its beauty is like the flower of the field” (Isaiah 40:6).

Yet the ashes placed upon the forehead are traced in the sign of the cross. Dust is marked with mercy. Mortality is marked with Christ. For “the Word became flesh” (John 1:14) and bore our sin upon the tree. Lent leads us again to that saving cross, not to prove our devotion, but to receive His forgiveness.

“Be reconciled to God” (2 Corinthians 5:20). In Him, even dust is promised resurrection.

The meeting began with a devotion on Titus 2. A Mission Presentation was given by Rev. Jensen on Wittenberg Student Center at Illinois State University. In late December, Christ Lutheran Church of the Deaf in Jacksonville had flooding in the sanctuary and basement due to frozen pipes. Water has been removed, and repairs are being made. The Formula of Concord study continued with Art. 2, Free Will. The board approved submitting the Overture: “To Affirm and Use Biblical Terminology concerning Ministry”, to the Synod in Convention.

The special meeting was called to appoint an Acting District President for the Central Illinois District. Vice President Rev. Mark Eddy was appointed.
